'INITIATION' - A LIFE ALTERING EVENT

Ritual has existed elsewhere in our society to similar good ends. A special form of ritual is initiation. Though in a broad sense initiation can denote any ceremony which receives someone into a group, let us define it as a ritual intended to admit a candidate into a society possessing secret knowledge, and calculated to produce a life altering transformation. Wow! What a mouthful!

Ritual and ceremony are not the same thing, although closely related. For those participating, ceremonies provide an external expression to an internal process. Without that internal act, the ceremony cannot achieve the desired effect. Ritual is intended to be more than mere ceremony. But unless the candidate desires change, internalizes the experience, and then acts upon it in a positive way, nothing will change in his nature or in his life.

Consider a wedding as both ceremony and ritual. For those attending and observing it is a ceremony filled with tradition and nearly always a joyous occasion. It is a set of acts performed on a special occasion much like a play. But for the couple it is ritual that unites two adults into one, that redefines the relationship between their families and forms a bond intended to survive and flourish through all adversities. For the couple the wedding ritual is a life-altering event.

Masonic ritual is much the same. The ritual of initiation redefines the relationship of the candidate between himself and his Lodge, his brethren, and his friends and family. The ceremony of the Entered Apprentice Degree is also filled with tradition and nearly always a joyous occasion. For the candidate, the ceremony of initiation and the ritual of the Entered Apprentice Degree forms a bond intended to survive and flourish throughout the candidate's life and throughout all adversities. It is a life-altering event.

Support your Lodge and its officers as they use both ceremony and ritual, filled with tradition, to make our candidate's experience of initiation a life-altering event. Help build the strong ties that will bind the candidate to Masonry throughout his life. Come to Lodge and participate.

Brother Oscar Woody was one of five Postal workers on the Titanic. He was born April 15, 1868 and died on his 44th birthday in the sinking of that great ship. When his body was found floating on the ocean his personal effects included a Masonic pocket knife and his dues card from Acacia Lodge No. 16 in Clifton Station (now known as Clifton, in Fairfax county). The beautiful commemorative medal depicted at the top of page 1 was issued by the Grand Lodge of Virginia in 2008.
