May has now arrived and my series of messages based on the months of the year continues, although some other notations will follow. The fifth month of the year in both the Julian and Gregorian calendars is May and it is one of seven months with 31 days. By the way, how many times are months with 31 days consecutive? In our Northern Hemisphere, it is a month of spring, while autumn has arrived in the Southern Hemisphere.

The month was named for the Greek goddess Maia, who is identified with the Roman goddess of fertility, Bona Dea. The Roman poet Ovid, however, says that May is named for the maiores, Latin for "elders".


