- b. Lodge educational officer will present a program in lodge (when restrictions are lifted) or distribute an educational program electronically (either via email or on our webpage) when restrictions are still in effect.
- 3) <u>Social/Interactive time</u> is important. Every 2nd Thursday at 7pm, Zoom meetings (secured by password) will held with the following objectives:
- a. Serve as a check-in social time for all members.
- b. Keep up to date on important changes as they occur.
- c. Provide an opportunity for members to ask questions or make remarks on the program presented/distributed at the last stated communication.
- 4) Ritual Practice Every 3rd Thursday will continue and be held and focus on Degree and Floor work.
- 5) <u>Individual or small group instruction</u> will be offered Every 4th Thursday. We will not have regular practice, but rather a week off or time for individual instruction for line officers and others who are looking to attain their certificate or learn a lecture.
- 6) Catechism Practice will occur on the Wednesday preceding each Stated Communication.



HISTORICAL TIDBITS TO CHEW UPON

The *Regius Manuscript*, written in Middle English, is the first known document about Freemasonry. It was written about 1390 A.D. and was apparently copied from an older document. Athalstan (925-940) virtually King of all England, and according to the *Regius Manuscript*, called the Masons to meet at York, England sometime between 926 and 932 A.D.

In Scotland, the earliest lodge records still in existence were recorded in Aitchison's Haven in 1598 and minutes of Mary's Chapel Lodge at Edinburgh are unbroken from 1599. In England, only the records of Alnwick between the dates of 1700 and 1717 are known to have been recorded. To be historically accurate, we cannot go beyond six centuries to find lodges of Masons accepting men of other than operative craftsmen.

Stonemasons, in some form, have existed all over the world since the dawn of time and long before the building of the pyramids in Egypt. It is not difficult to imagine that there had to be stone masons, and other craftsmen, since men first began to build edifices to protect themselves from the elements.

If this message has touched your interest and will prompt you to do some further research in the ancient records of Masonry, then it has accomplished its object. Take it upon yourself to look up the history of such things as – where did the term lodge come from? What other manuscripts are important in Masonry? Seek and ye shall find the history of Freemasonry.

Remember to support your officers. Your officers need you in attendance at our Stated Meetings when the attendance requirements permit. Call your officers – phone calls are not restricted. Neither are emails. Let them communicate with you how your Lodge is progressing and how much your interest in Tuckahoe is meaningful to them. Renew your friendships, maybe some you have forgotten. Let us welcome you to Tuckahoe Lodge No. 347, in person, by phone, or by email as we progress through our 98th year. Soon it will be 100 and I know you will want to be in Lodge for that momentous occasion. Remember, it will only happen once. As Walter Cronkite used to say, "What kind of day was it?
