#### THE SECRETARY'S CORNER

Outside activities usually go hand-in-hand with the bright sunshine so common during our summer months. However, we must take steps to avoid health problems that are associated with this same time of year. Be wise when the temperature soars and the humidity is high.

- Drink plenty of fluids, starting before you leave your home or go outdoors. Sodas do not help, as they add salt to your body.
- Minimize outdoor activities or exercises.
- Wear wide-brimmed hats and loose fitting clothing.
- Stay in the shade and "keep your cool".
- Ask your doctor if any of your medications might put you at a higher risk of heat stroke and if you should restrict your daytime activities.

If you notice any new sensations such as dizziness, light-headedness, fatigue, dry mouth, or irritability, you may be experiencing the first signs of hypothermia. You should immediately get out of the heat and seek medical attention.

Remember, the older you are, the less you perspire, you lose more bodily fluids, and your body just normally is less efficient in cooling you off. Please remember to "keep your cool".
