THE SECRETARY'S MASONIC TIDBITS

Candidates during the time of the Operative Masons took their obligations on the Old Charges and not on a Holy Book.

By 1700, Freemasonry consisted of two degrees. It was not until the 1720's that the three degree system made its appearance.

The gavel is one of the oldest working tools used by man; one of the first explained to the new Mason as an Entered Apprentice; and is the emblem of authority in the hands of the Worshipful Master. It has on occasion been called a 'Hiram'.

The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania is referred to as 'Right Worshipful', whereas in all other United States jurisdictions he is called 'Most Worshipful'.

The Grand Lodge of Massachusetts is the only Grand Lodge in the United States that has a name only for their Lodges, no number (such as Tuckahoe No. 347).
