IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MEMBERS OF TUCKAHOE LODGE

On March 4, 2010, the following proposed amendments to the by-laws of Tuckahoe Lodge No. 347, A.F.& A.M. were submitted to the Secretary, to be made a part of the minutes and read in open Lodge. The proposed amendments will lie over until our next stated communication (April 8, 2010) at which time they will be read again for consideration, whereupon the Worshipful Master will set aside an appropriate amount of time for discussion by the membership.

These proposed amendments will be posted on the Lodge web page, printed in the April issue of the Trestleboard and sent by email to members, in order to satisfy the requirement of notifying the membership of proposed changes to the by-laws. In accordance with Article VIII of the by-laws, approval of any amendments will require a two-thirds affirmative vote for adoption. Amendments that may be approved by the membership will go into effect January 1, 2011.

Article II:

<u>Current</u> – Every member of this Lodge, except the Treasurer, Secretary, Tiler and one Chaplain, shall be charged by the Secretary with the sum of forty dollars (\$40), plus Grand Lodge dues and assessments, as annual dues.

<u>Proposed</u> - Every member of this Lodge, except the Treasurer, Secretary, Tiler and one Chaplain, shall be charged by the Secretary with the sum of fifty-four dollars (\$54), plus Grand Lodge dues and assessments, as annual dues.

Article III:

<u>Current-</u> The total fees for the degrees in the Lodge, including that amount which must accompany the petition, shall be one hundred thirty (\$130), payable as follows:

forty dollars (\$40) for the degree of Entered Apprentice; and

forty dollars (\$40) for the degree of Fellowcraft; and

forty dollars (\$40) for the degree of Master Mason; and

ten dollars (\$10) shall accompany the petition.

Proposed – The total fees for the degrees in the Lodge, including that amount which must accompany the petition, shall be two-hundred fifty dollars (\$250), payable as follows: seventy-five dollars (\$75) for the degree of Entered Apprentice; and seventy-five dollars (\$75) for the degree of Fellowcraft; and seventy-five dollars (\$75) the degree of Master Mason; and twenty-five dollars (\$25) shall accompany the petition.

Article IV:

<u>Current-</u> The treasurer shall receive an annual compensation of three hundred dollars (\$300) Payable in quarterly installments.

<u>Proposed</u>- The treasurer shall receive an annual compensation of five hundred eighty (\$580) payable in quarterly installments.

Article V:

<u>Current-</u> The Secretary shall receive an annual compensation of five hundred dollars (\$500) payable in quarterly installments.

<u>Proposed</u> - The Secretary shall receive an annual compensation of five hundred eighty dollars (\$580) payable in quarterly installments.

Article VI:

<u>Current-</u> The Tiler, or acting Tiler, shall receive a compensation of fifteen dollars (\$15) for each communication he attends in that capacity.

<u>Proposed-</u> The Tiler, or acting Tiler, shall receive a compensation of twenty dollars (\$20) for each communication he attends in that capacity.

No changes are proposed to Articles I, VII, or VIII.

A small nugget from the quarry.... For all Master Masons the word HIRAM needs no explanation. Whether they take it to mean as Hiram, King of Tyre or Hiram Abif, the widow's son, it is most certainly descriptive of an exemplary life of either of these two great forefathers of Masonry and suggestive of those Masonic and moral virtues, which every Masonic brother is striving to possess and cultivate.
