Tuckahoe Lodge Memorial Service – 2022

The Lodge overhead lights are turned off for the service. The speaker begins the service by lighting a single candle, and turning over an hourglass to allow the sands to run. The Lodge Musician begins a soft background of hymns or other appropriate music.

Speaker: The hourglass is an antiquated timing device consisting of two glass chambers connected vertically by a narrow passage that allows sand to trickle from the upper part to the lower by means of gravity. The amount of sand determines the amount of time that passes as the chamber is emptied. The image of the sand being emptied in the hourglass gives us a visual metaphor for the limited duration of human life, and for the inevitability of change in the world as a whole.

We can never turn back the sands of time, though we may wish to relive a special memory, a happy moment, or say goodbye one last time. We can't, because the sands of time keep falling, and we can't turn over the hourglass.

Five of our brethren have entered the Celestial Lodge this year. They are now in the safekeeping of their creator. As is our custom, we are here to remember them one last time. Remember them for their loyalty to the Craft, for their devotion to their families and to us. Here are the names and date of passing of those whom we honor and remember tonight.
