In fact one of the Lodges that meet in our temple (Richmond Lodge No. 10) was chartered in 1780.

Classes of Masonic instruction are held Thursday evenings at 7 P.M. When a Stated or Called Communication is scheduled for a Thursday, class is held the preceding Wednesday at 7 P.M. No classes are held during the month of December.

The Lodge is located at 5500 Bethlehem Road (corner of Bethlehem and Dickens Roads) with ample parking available. The Lodge Room and dining facilities are situated on ground level for easy access.
