Tuckahoe History

- March 2003 - MW Fred Martin III has his official visit to Tuckahoe. During the meeting he is presented with an Honorary Membership. His theme was 'Freemasonry, Pass It On'.
- June 14th, 2003 - Grand Lodge dedicated the new Tuckahoe Masonic Temple. From the notes, there would have been nearly 100 people in attendance.
- May 2004 - Following a recent GLOVA and and Prince Hall GLOVA visitation agreements, 3 members of Tuckahoe Lodge were some of the first to take advantage of this agreement and visit Richmond Lodge No. 65.
- April 2005 - MW John Quinley has his official visit to Tuckahoe. His son, Todd Quinley, was Worshipful Master the same year at Tuckahoe.
- Tuckahoe was quite active these years - large attendance at classes, multiple events going on, and several committees. One of those events was the famous 'Fish Fries'. Much larger number of new Master Masons raised as well.
- August 2005 - MW Al Tignor passes away. He was very active in Tuckahoe right up to his passing.
- 2008 - Wor. Marshall Messimer notes that email will be used for the Trestleboard to help save on postage costs.
- November 2008 - Past Grand Masters Night
- 2009 - A new Masonic Library built in the ante-room housing over 200 books!
- 2011 - J. Ned Culler award created to recognize members to honor his legacy.
